

REHOMING OUR RESCUES

Our Kennels and Cattery are not just facilities; they are sanctuaries where each animal's journey from rescue to adoption is handled with compassion and respect. We aim never to turn away an animal in need of our help and to give them a second chance at life, a 67-year-old promise we strive to keep.

In 2023, our shelter admitted 800 dogs and 565 cats into our care. They arrived at our shelter from all directions and via every possible route – found by our inspectors and brought in as strays, led in by heartbroken owners unable to afford their care, left by individuals who just didn't want them anymore, or brought in by kind strangers who noticed them roaming the streets and recognised that AWSS offered them the greatest hope for a better future.



By highlighting the joy and fulfillment that comes with adopting a pet in need, we hope to continue to inspire others to open their hearts and homes to the "Rescue" breed. Through collective efforts and a shared commitment to animal welfare, we can make a lasting impact and create a brighter future for all shelter animals.




Pippie's purrrfect place









Our Volunteers


